SUMMARY OF TRANSFER OPTIONS:

Students interested in the University of Mary Nursing program have 3 main options. Completion of the Nursing program in 4 years assumes that the student has completed **all** of the courses listed on the curriculum guide, based on the option they choose. If they do not have all of these completed, it will most likely take longer than 4 years. All students are strongly advised to meet with the U-Mary Admissions Rep on campus at BSC at their earliest interest, so that the U-Mary rep can confirm that the student is on the right track to graduating in the least amount of time possible. The three main tracks are as follows:

Option I: Transfer to U-Mary after 1 year at BSC. This option is the recommended option because it gives the students the best chance of getting done in 4 years, and of getting into the Nursing program. However, as with all options, the student should be made aware that admission to the University does not guarantee admission into the nursing program. All students should be aware of this, but it should be especially stressed to students with a GPA below 3.0.

Option II: Transfer to U-Mary after Fall semester of sophomore year. In this option, the student would transfer to U-Mary after completing their third semester at BSC. Once they transfer, they would then take NUR 240 in the Spring at U-Mary, and apply for admission into the Nursing Division that semester. If they are accepted, they need to take NUR 242 and NUR 248 (10 credits total) that same summer. If the student does not take those courses over the summer, they will be a year behind.

Option III: Transfer to U-Mary after Spring semester of sophomore year. This is the least recommended option, because it is least compatible with completing their degree in 4 years, and could cause additional financial burdens. In this option, the student must take NUR 240 online through U-Mary during their Spring semester at BSC, in addition to their BSC courses. They must also take NUR 242 and NUR 248 (10 credits total) on campus at U-Mary during the summer. If either of these requirements is not met, the student will be a year behind.

REQUIREMENTS FOR ADMISSION INTO THE NURSING PROGRAM ARE:

- Completed Application Form
- Two completed recommendation and appraisal forms
- Cumulative GPA of 3.0 or higher on U-Mary and transferred courses.
- Grade of "C" or higher in each of the following nursing prerequisite courses and official transcript for transferred credits.

**Enrollment in NUR 240 (Intro to Nursing as a Profession) is restricted to students who have declared Nursing as a major and hold a current CNA license. All other nursing (NUR) courses are restricted to students who have been accepted into the Division of Nursing.*

- **REPEATS:** No nursing/nursing prerequisite course (above listed courses) may be repeated more than once. The grade received during the student's second attempt will be used. The total number of nursing/nursing prerequisite courses which may be repeated is limited to two. Repeated classes will include those from which a student has withdrawn (W, WP, WF). Students who withdraw due to nonacademic reasons may request consideration for admission.
- A student who has not successfully completed all attempted pre-requisite courses cannot be accepted into the Nursing Division.
- American Heart Association Basic Life Support for Health Care Providers Certification © is required (two year certification). This must be obtained and in place at the start of the junior year.
- Criminal background checks and signed disclosure form.
- Signed Professional Behavior contract.
- Applicant must meet all deadlines set by the University of Mary and be in good standing with prior institutions.

Applicants are considered primarily on the basis of academic achievement as evidenced by minimum cumulative GPA of 3.0. This GPA must be maintained through the sophomore year to progress into the Junior year. Preferential consideration is given to applicants who have taken all prerequisite coursework at the University of Mary, and have demonstrated participation in volunteer activities. Entry into the nursing major is competitive and class size is limited.

PROGRESSION:

Once admitted, students must earn a grade of C or higher in nursing courses. The total number of nursing courses (NUR) which may be repeated is limited to one. This includes NUR 240 and NUR 240, which are taken prior to admission. Repeated classes will also include those from which a student has withdrawn (W, WP, WF). Students who withdraw due to nonacademic reasons may request consideration for readmission. Permission to continue will be granted or denied based on the circumstance related to the failure and the space availability in the course.
