ASSOCIATES DEGREES

The AA degree is a two-year degree and is usually geared toward students interested in fields like humanities, communication, or social sciences, while the AS degree often emphasizes areas like biology, math, or physical sciences. Dual credit classes cover many of these required courses, giving students a head start on their college journey and helping them explore potential fields of study.
