

TRANSFER

Psychology study at BSC supplies the first two years of coursework toward a baccalaureate degree in a psychology specialty. Instruction is designed to provide a base of general education and introductory psychology courses. The program focuses on enabling a student's understanding of 1) psychological principles and their application to everyday life situations, 2) the needs of people and their behavior under stress, and 3) development of initial skills basic to a career in human services or professional psychology. The program also enhances student knowledge of human behavior for those entering the workforce or seeking service courses as a non-major. Graduates earn either an Associate in Science or Associate in Arts degree.

PREPARATION AND REQUIREMENTS

Prospective psychology students should have an interest in human behavior. Suggested high school classes include psychology and other social sciences, math preparation for

college algebra and statistics, and good writing skills. To advance in this field, students should expect to obtain an advanced degree.
